





Bill #	Title	What it Does	Position
SB1109	Designated countries; land ownership; prohibition	Prohibits people from countries seen as a U.S. security risk (like China, Russia, Iran, etc.) from buying, owning or having more than a 30% interest in land in Arizona.	
SB1164	Immigration laws; local enforcement	Establishes the Arizona ICE Act which requires local law enforcement to work with federal immigration officials to enforce immigration laws.	
SB1268	Hospitals; patient immigration status; reporting	Requires hospitals who accept ACCHS (state funding for patients) to report patients' immigration status.	YOU DECIDE
SB1092	Vehicle mileage; tracking; tax; prohibition	Prohibits the tracking of vehicle mileage and the imposition of mileage-based taxes.	
SB1094	Business; discrimination prohibition; social criteria	<u>Prevents</u> businesses from discriminating against individuals based on social beliefs, affiliations or behaviors.	
SB1099	Sexually explicit materials; government; prohibition	Protects minors from exposure to sexually explicit materials by government entities and their contractors.	
SB1100 and SB1101	Maricopa County; Divisions; new counties	Splits up Maricopa County moving parts into Gila County, La Paz County; Pinal County; Yavapai County and Yuma County	
HB2099	Governor; attorney general; duties; immigration	It <u>requires</u> the Governor to cooperate with federal immigration actions and allows the Attorney General to represent the state in legal matters affecting state property or claims against the state.	
HB2112	Internet pornography; minors; age verification	Requires sexually explicit websites verify users are 18 and over. Protects minors.	
HB2207	Child sex trafficking; juvenile defendants	Child sex trafficking is now a mandatory life sentence. This law will provide exception for those under 18.	
HB2340	Murder; law enforcement officer; punishment	<u>Imposes</u> stricter penalties for the murder of law enforcement officers.	
HB2371	Planning; home design; restrictions; prohibition	Allows apartment style density in single family residential areas that can't be stopped by the city. Prevents cities from regulating specific design features of single-family homes. Cities cannot mandate lot sizes above 1,500 sq feet enabling densities of up to 24 homes/acre .	
HB2005	Voter registration; recorder; inactive status	Authorizes the County Recorder to place an individual on inactive voter status if they receive information that they fraudulently registered to vote, or their registration information is incorrect.	
HB2004	Voter registration cards; mailing limitation	Aims to ensure the accuracy of voter registration rolls by implementing stricter mailing and follow-up procedures for voter registration cards.	
HB2673	Early ballots; deadlines; foreign monies	Addresses early voting procedures and handling of foreign money in elections, ensuring transparency in the electoral process. Prevents undue influences from foreign entities.
