By limiting unnecessary cell phone usage, the bill aims to enhance student engagement, encourage face-to-face interactions, and promote better mental health outcomes.


This initiative highlights Arizona's dedication to creating supportive and balanced educational spaces that prioritize the long-term development and success of its youth.




The Legislature has taken steps to address the issue responsibly by advancing legislation to fully fund the program while introducing necessary safeguards to prevent future financial instability.
